



Collection Selection

Haemanthus Albiflos

An evergreen South African bulbous geophyte belonging to the Amaryllidaceae family. Prized horticulturally for its unusual appearance and extreme tolerance of neglect. 18" long leaves lay over flat to the ground. The flowers, carried on top of 1-2' long stalks are composed of a brush of white flowers with bright yellow stamen anthers that are surrounded by 2 large white bracts. The bloom does not form petals. Flowering occurs in late fall to early winter.

- ◆ **Requires dappled shade similar to that preferred by clivias**
- ◆ **Plant in groups under trees or in containers**
- ◆ **Plant in well drained soil in a shady location**
- ◆ **Water regularly**
