Flying Dragon *Poncirus trifoliata*

Also called the Japanese hiryo, this plant was introduced to the U.S. in 1915. It bears lovely large & fragrant blossoms in the spring, but is mostly considered a curious monstrosity with its severe-looking limbs and jagged thorns. The Flying Dragon bears a golfball-sized inedible fruit with a rough orange rind. Its flesh is pale yellow and has six to eight sections and many seeds. It's a deciduous shrub that is extremely hardy in winter.
